FOREST DAYS is founded on the belief that children are capable and intrinsically motivated, and will learn as they build relationships with each other and the land. Exploration, free play, appropriate and supervised risk-taking, gratitude, and care for the earth are at its heart.

EVERY SESSION unfolds differently depending on the season, weather, participant needs and interests. There are opportunities for ecological and interdisciplinary exploration using science, art, storytelling, and stewardship, all taking place in the natural world on school grounds. - \*Place-based: Place-based education uses local community and environment as a starting point to teach concepts in language arts, mathematics, social studies, science and other subjects across the curriculum. Emphasizing hands-on, real-world learning experiences, it increases academic achievement, helps students develop stronger ties to their community, enhances student appreciation for the natural world, and helps create active, contributing citizens. (Sobel, 2017)
- \*\*Emergent Curriculum: Emergent Curriculum supports learning that is based on the children's interest. Learning occurs naturally, and children thrive and learn best when their interests are considered and captured. (CNAC, 2017)
