**1** NORTH LOOP: 1 Mile. From Kingdom Rd trailhead, proceed 0.25 miles to intersection. Go right and pass by the turnout to Fourth Pond, or left though blueberry field and oak forest.

**2** CONNECTOR: 0.5 Miles, connecting North and South Loop trails.

SOUTH LOOP: 1 Mile. Connects to the Mines Rd Trail travels through mixed forest and varied topography.

**3** NATURE LOOP: 0.75 Miles. Begins at the western most parking area on the Kingdom Rd and travels though wooded terrain.

WOODS ROAD: 0.75 Miles. Begins on the Kingdom Rd. right after the pavement ends and travels though wooded terrain and past blueberry fields. The first section is wide and quite flat. After a set of boulders the road is much more uneven and can be wet. Please note, this trail is used by other neighboring land owners.

## **About Kingdom Woods**

Thanks to the generous support of our donors, Kingdom Woods Conservation Area (878 acres) parcels were acquired between 1998-2006.

Look for lady slippers, glacial erratics, Camp Stream Granite (approx. 419 million years old) and Ellsworth Schist geologic units.

KWCA is important for deer, moose, bear, bobcat, muskrat, beaver, snowshoe hare, waterfowl, and song birds. There are also several thriving vernal pools.
